Innovation Grant Spotlight


When the Bureau of Library Development put out a call for Innovation Grant applications last year, we received so many creative ideas from libraries across the state. Below is just one example of a library striving to meet the needs of its community.

Renae Rountree, Washington County Public Library Director, recognized a need in her community when The Office of Early Learning reported that about 45% of children in Washington County were unprepared to start school.

To help combat the digital gap, Renae purchased Launchpads pre-loaded with educational content geared toward three- to five-year-old children. Launchpads are available at each of the library's locations, and seven of the devices are checked out to the Early Learning Coalition of Northwest Florida. From there, they are shared with school readiness providers in Washington County.

Renae reported that the program has received a lot of interest and use from families in the community. She also provided some quick tips for libraries that might be interested in duplicating this program:

- Buy the warranty for an extra year. It's \$10/device, but it's worth the extra cost.
- Reassure parents that the devices are covered by warranty, as many parents are concerned about the cost of having to replace the devices if they are lost or damaged.

community a library serves.
