2015 Florida Public Library Directors' Meeting

On October 28 and 29, 115 library leaders from across the state gathered in Tallahassee for the Annual Public Library Directors' meeting. Secretary of State Ken Detzner opened the meeting by welcoming the group and expressing appreciation for the difference that libraries continue to make across the state.

John Huber, one of the featured speakers, spent the first day with the group talking about purpose-based libraries. The next day, Stacie Ledden, Director of Innovation and Brand Strategy at Anythink Libraries, shared concepts and ideas on the topic of "Library as Brand: Striving for the Emotional Space." Finishing out the meeting was Lourdes Aceves, Urban Library Council Senior Program Manager, who discussed the Edge Initiative.

The additional document deadline for the State Aid to Libraries Grant program is **December 1, 2015**. Additional grant application documents must be submitted online in the [Florida Libraries and Grants System](#) on or before this date.

Chat With Jana -- It Takes a Village: Strategies for Successful Library Partnerships





This e-resource includes content in key subject areas, such as administration, bilingual education, child development and psychology, funding, health education, technology, and testing. The majority of the full-text titles included are also found in the ERIC database.
- The [Professional Collection](#) offers balanced coverage for any educator or user interested in professional development.
