If a similar program had appeared in either the 1979 or 1980 manual we did not include it in this collection unless it had a new or slightly different "twist". 

- 1. NAME OF PROGRAM: A VISIT WITH THE BIRDS OR "Quiet, there's a canary in the Library!"
- 2. DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM: A local lady (who is also an elementary school teacher) has a collection of many fine exotic birds. She brought the birds to the Library for the weekly Story Hour program for 3 - 6 year old children, demonstrated what they could do and explained to the children about the care and feeding of these pets.

She told the children about the Center and demonstrated how to care for injured birds. She then showed a slide presentation about the Center and wild birds and animals in the area.



## STORY DAY AT THE LIBRARY

On August 13th, from 9 A.M. until 4 P.M., the Taylor County Public Library is hosting its first all day story hour for children as well as adults. Everyone is invited to come and stay as long as they like while they are entertained through stories, songs, and other specialties presented by local and out-of-town talent.

The schedule for the day consists of:

9 A.M. - 9:15 Elder B. Joy- "The Giving Tree"

9:30 A.M.- Happytime Kindergarten presentation

10 A.M.- 10:30- our own Mary Whitfield- Nostalgic glimpses of Taylor County history

11:00 A.M.- Nancy Mosley- a superb storyteller from Suwannee River Regional Library at Live Oak along with another guest from that area.

1 P.M. - Rayma Ball -stories

1:30- 2:30 - Sue Crum- Director of Wakulla County Public Library in Crawfordville-"Miss Sue" will share several of her favorites with us, including "Crab and Jaquar" and "The Story of Ferdinand."

2:30- The talented Carol Demps will present a series of special stories

~~3 P.M. - 3:15- Elder D. Schiers - story~~

~~3:30 "The Book of Job" . -N.F.J.C. Drama Class~~

The last two events cancelled out-got the public speaking system out and let the children come up and tell stories and sing - this was lots of fun for them. Some of them left crying when they had to leave at 4 P.M. This was a great experience and everyone seemed to enjoy the day.

Name of Program - BOOKNIC

Description - a book discussion/brown bag picnic combination that had each child booktalk his or her own book.

Step-by-step program instruction - after promoting the idea during school visits, I set aside one day before summer programming began to register interested kids. During this registration, I lined up several mothers who agreed to help transport the kids to and from a local riverside park (about one mile away). Everyone who registered was told to bring a book they had read and a brown bag lunch to the library on the days scheduled for the booknic. Library books or privately owned books were welcomed. I supplied the sheets to sit on. After meeting at the library, the kids piled into the cars and we made our way to the park, where we selected our permanent booknic site in a shady grove of trees, and sat down to a leisurely hour and a half of lunch and booktalks. After the kids got to know one another, they began to expand upon the booktalk by bringing drawings, puppets, etc. to illustrate the book they were talking about.

Costs - whatever the transportation cost may be.

Review - the kids loved selling their books, and they were also an attentive audience. They enjoyed swapping the books after each meeting, and discussing various issues the books sometimes brought up.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM: Comprised of one orientation meeting and 9 storytime sessions, this series was devised to free staff for SUMMER LIBRARY EXPRESS commitments and still provide programming for ages 3-5. The format featured an opening by library assistant, dividing into 5 small groups for picture-books presented by mothers, then back to the large group for film, craft, game, etc. While this took place in the Meeting Room, there was also one parent-led group of 8-12 two-year-olds and a "non-group" of school-aged brothers and sisters in the Children's Room.
3. STEP-BY-STEP PROGRAM INSTRUCTIONS: \_\_\_\_\_  
Devise program sessions. Register children on first-to-sign-up  
basis. Convince mothers to participate! Three volunteers  
who were very experienced from working with our preschool programs  
in the past were invaluable in setting a good tone and convincing  
mothers to volunteer.
4. COSTS: incidental crafts costs
5. REVIEW OF PROGRAMS SUCCESS: This program did happen to reach several new patrons. Success of parent participation was uneven in quality and quantity. Individual talents were spotlighted (i.e. one mom & school-aged daughter showed us how to sign nursery rhymes from Gallaudet College Press's NURSERY RHYMES FROM MOTHER GOOSE IN SIGNED ENGLISH.) Seemed to meet varied needs of different age levels, but was also frustrating to parents who couldn't be with all of their children. Parents got to know each other, and they better appreciate the preparation needed for story-  
times.







1. NAME OF PROGRAM: Balloon Animals (Part of a weekly "Boxcar of Stories & Activities")

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM: A friend of a staff member and her three sons instructed children and parents in the art of twisting balloons into shapes to make parrots, bees, swords, lovebirds, and mice.

3. STEP-BY-STEP PROGRAM INSTRUCTIONS: I purchased "birds & bees" and animal balloons from a theatrical supply store. (Also a manual). A week prior to the program the boys showed me how to make the animals and we displayed the results with a poster to advertise the program. The day of the program they demonstrated the technique and divided the children into 3 groups by age.

4. COSTS: Approximately \$6.00 for balloons and manual

5. REVIEW OF PROGRAMS SUCCESS: Program was great! We had over 60 people squeaking, blowing, and twisting balloons. The noise was deafening and the enthusiasm overwhelming! Every child took home one to two balloon creatures and they stayed 1½ hours instead of the scheduled 45 minutes. \*

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM: Children string paper beads made from magazine pages on yarn to make necklaces.



2. DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM: A different country was represented each week. In a one hour session, books and stories about the country or craft were viewed and enjoyed. Then we did the craft itself.

Some children left their crafts for display, and picked them up later. The program was an eight week series, and presented at two branches each week. The theme was also carried into the puppet show for that week.




