# Program Overview

Welcome to the Florida Library Youth Program (FLYP) for 2008! This manual is a starting point to help you plan for special programs throughout the year. The 2008 Florida Library Youth Program Manual includes *Whole Wide World @ My Public Library* and *Technopop*.

## **Funding**

The Florida Library Youth Program is funded through a federal Library Services and Technology Act grant. This legislation provides that LSTA-funded projects target *persons having difficulty using a library*, including children in poverty and those with special needs. Libraries are encouraged to provide outreach programs and deposit collections at non-library locations such as camps, parks and recreation centers, summer schools, churches, and clubs.

## **Goals**

The program goals are to:

- Create lifelong readers and library users
- Emphasize the value of the public library and the services it offers
- Provide an opportunity for children to explore the wealth of information and fun waiting for them in a friendly, encouraging atmosphere
- Provide language and literature experiences that expand children's knowledge about the world, as well as enhance literacy
- Encourage library use for leisure and continued learning during the time that school is not in session

## **Philosophy**

Rewards and/or recognition for completing individual contracts, number of pages or number of minutes read, attending specific programs, or teamwork should be handled in such a way that all children have a positive experience. Libraries are encouraged to avoid a competition.

## The Whole Wide World @ My Public Library

The 2008 Florida Library Youth Program Manual for elementary and/or all audiences is multicultural. The committee decided to include the whole wide world by highlighting each continent, and the people and cultures they encompass. This component is planned for all ages with a focus on elementary school-aged children.

A story time program might begin with an introduction of the continent by locating it on a globe or world map, and talking about the distance from Florida to the various countries and how long it would take to fly. Librarians would select a country or countries that would be presented and then have everyone board a plane to fly to the first country. When you arrive in the country, you could present a few brief facts through pictures, a PowerPoint picture presentation, and/or a welcoming song or greeting in the language.

Oral storytelling passed from generation to generation guides us through life. “Don’t talk to strangers” (Little Red Riding Hood) or “You must keep your promise” (The Frog Prince) were lessons that were reinforced through fairy tales. All over the world, variations of these tales are told. Are Cinderella’s small feet influenced by the Chinese practice of foot binding? [Yeh-shen](#), the Chinese tale, is the earlier recorded story. In any case, these stories were told to teach children lessons. Old or new, stories give us insights to the many cultures of the world and help us understand the people of these cultures better.
