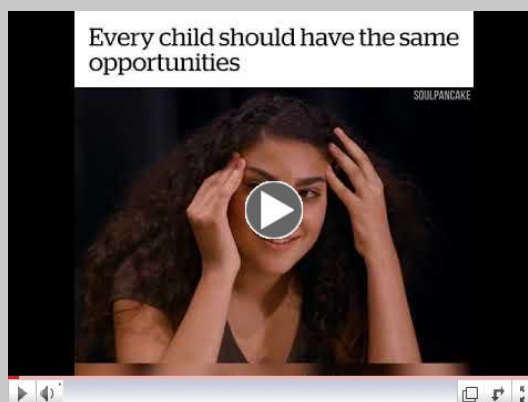
MyFree Taxes
